# Field Trip

# Discipline Plan

Our classroom discipline will be a stoplight chart. Each child will have a clothes pin and it will start on green each day. If I have to warn a child multiple times on something, their pen will move to the yellow. If they continue to not listen, then the pen will move to the red. At the end of the day, they will get to put a green, yellow or red sticker on their sticker chart. If at the end of the week they have all green they will get a prize out of the treasurer box. If they continue to be on red day after day, I will ask to meet with you to come up with a solution on how to work through this issue.

## Birthday Parties

Since we are only in school 3 days a week, we will celebrate birthdays on Fridays of the birthday week. We will go to chapel Friday morning at 8:20 am and I will go up front with the child, give a birthday blessing, pray over the child, then the school will sing happy birthday. After that we will go back to our classroom and do a birthday party. You are welcome to bring a small treat (cookies, brownies, Little Debbie snacks) I ask that you don't bring cake or cupcakes because the frosting will get everywhere.

# **Toilet Trained Policy**

\*Please take a few minutes to review the following questions and determine whether your child meets our school's definition of "toilet trained":

- Is my child able to undress themselves enough so that they can use the toilet without getting anything on their clothes?
- Is my child able to use the toilet without getting any urine on the floor?
- Is my child able to wipe themselves without assistance? (We understand young children may not have the motor skills to completely clean themselves after a bowel movement. We do, however, want your child to know that we cannot assist them with this at school.)
- Is my child able to redress themselves in case they have an occasional accident? (Teachers will help with buttons and zippers.)

If you answered No to any of the questions above or if your child meets any of the items on the following list, you might want to reconsider if they are ready for school or need an additional year to prepare:

- If your child wears pull-ups, day or night.
- If you notice your child is having accidents intentionally.
- If your child refuses to use the bathroom when instructed to try.
