-Policies & Procedures-

- **Discipline/Classroom Management:** Students will be taking part in our Classroom Economy. Please see the attached pages for more information.
- **<u>GroupMe</u>**: We will be using the mobile app "GroupMe" to communicate with you throughout the year. This will include messages, pictures and updates.
- <u>Weekly Note:</u> You will get a weekly note from your child's homeroom teacher with reminders about tests, quizzes, and other things happening in the classroom throughout the next week. <u>Please make sure you read the note each week so</u> you don't miss something important!
- <u>Homework:</u> We will not regularly assign work to be done exclusively at home. Most of the homework the students will have will be anything they don't finish in class. Occasionally something extra may be assigned to be finished at home. <u>Any work turned in late will be a fine as well as ten points off for each day it is late.</u>
- <u>Absent Work:</u> If your child is absent, they will be expected to make up any work missed for the days they are gone. They will have one day per day absent to finish any work they have missed. If they miss any scheduled tests and were present in class to have all study materials, they will be expected to take any missed tests on the day they return. If they return on a spelling day, they will still be expected to have their spelling completed and be prepared for the test for that week.
- <u>Planners:</u> Everything that we assign in class is to be written in the planner as we assign it. If the student completes it in class, one of us will initial it; otherwise, it is homework. I also require that these get signed by a parent each night. Please sign the book in the box with the date for the day.
- <u>Required Reading</u>: Students will be required to read a certain amount of pages each month from the month of September to the month of April. Required Reading is for a grade. Students will have the opportunity to receive a reward each month for completing the required reading, as well as be able to attend a party at the end of the year if they complete each month. There will also be bonus rewards for students who read the most pages and go above and beyond with their reading.
 - Requirements:
 - 6th Grade 450 pages
 - Must read at least one book they have not read before each month.

- Use the Reading Log to record the date finished, title of book, author of book, pages in book, star rating of book, and why they chose that rating.
- Students must have a parent/guardian sign their log before turning it into show they have indeed read throughout the month.
- Reading logs will be due the first day (that falls on a school day) of the next month.
- <u>Classroom Library:</u> I have a small library in my classroom. The students are welcome to check out one book at a time from it. I will take inventory of the books at the end of the year. <u>If a book is not returned, you will be billed through FACTS to replace it.</u>
- <u>Grades & Lesson Plans</u>: Two or three weeks after the start of each quarter, we will begin entering grades on a weekly basis. Please make sure you are checking them from time to time. You have access to your child's grades through your FACTS Family Portal. We will also post our weekly lesson plans on FACTS. If your student is absent or you need to check an assignment, you can access that through the Family Portal as well.
- <u>**Redos:**</u> Students may redo assignments with a grade below 70%, however, they will only receive 50% credit for the corrected questions. Any redos will come home with the graded papers in the Tuesday folder each week.
- <u>Scholastic Book Orders:</u> I will place a monthly order through Scholastic for anyone that would like to order books. You may order online or with the paper form. Our class code for online ordering is R8J3R. You are never obligated to order, but will always have the option. We can get free books for our classroom based on how much is ordered each month.
- <u>Class Descriptions, Tests, and Quizzes</u>: All tests and quizzes will be announced in class ahead of time and will also be included in my note for the week.
 - <u>Math (Miss Funk)</u>: There will be a math assignment daily. If they do not finish in class, it will be homework. There will be a test or quiz each week in math. Students will be allowed to correct all math <u>tests</u> for half credit regardless of the grade. The tests will come home in the Tuesday folder and any corrections must be turned back in before the next test.
 - <u>Spelling (Miss Dick)</u>: Spelling days will be each Tuesday. We will have a test over all the words as well as grade the spelling book pages. The students will write their spelling words three times each in cursive for another homework grade. These are due before the test on Tuesday. Once we have wrapped up each lesson with the test, I will assign the next lesson.

- Language (Miss Dick): Students will be completing daily language assignments where they will occasionally have homework from work that they did not complete in class. There will be an occasional quiz within the unit and a test at the end of each unit. We will complete a few written essay papers throughout the year. A rubric will be provided for each essay.
- <u>Reading (Miss Dick)</u>: Students will be reading and completing daily reading assignments through their reading curriculum and a couple of book studies. We will be having reading comprehension tests every few weeks this requires no preparation. Students will also complete a few book reports throughout the year. The type of report will vary, and I will send home instructions for each one with it is time. Required Reading will be a part of the students' reading grade.
- <u>History & Science (Mrs. Schones)</u>: These subjects will be taught alternately this year. We will cover a chapter in one subject and then move to a chapter in the other. Both classes will consist of a mixture of reading text, group discussion, activities, projects, games, and assignments. I will provide adequate time in class for assignments and activities. The only work students may need to finish at home would be work they did not finish in class and an occasional assigned project. There will be a test at the end of each chapter and an occasional unannounced quiz. Students will be allowed to correct all quizzes for half credit regardless of the grade. Students may also earn bonus points in these classes for writing the vocabulary words and definitions for the chapter. These will be due prior to that chapter's test.
- <u>Bible (Mrs. Hobbs)</u>: Students will be tested over a memory verse each week. They will have a unit test every two weeks. They may occasionally have some homework pages as well. Memory Verses can be found on <u>www.deeprootsbible.com</u>.
- <u>Electives:</u> Students have the option of taking different electives on Tuesday afternoon. They chose these class at the beginning of the school year.
- **<u>Project-Based Learning:</u>** Students will be participating in a project-based learning class on Friday afternoons with Mrs. Schones and Miss Dick.
- <u>Textbooks</u>: The students will be using textbooks for science, history and reading. These books are the property of the school. It will be the student's responsibility to take care of these books over the course of the year.
- <u>Class Mission</u>: We are excited to be able to go back to the Veterans' center for BINGO again this year! A schedule will be sent home of the dates we will attend. We will alternate visits with Miss Dick's homeroom.

- <u>Class Parties</u>: We will have three holiday parties. You are welcome to attend the party/parties that you sign up for. You will sign up to help with one class party.

 - o God's Love Party: February 14, 2024
 - o Resurrection Party: March 28, 2024
- <u>Birthdays:</u> Each student will receive a special blessing in chapel on their birthday. You are welcome to come for their blessing. You may also bring a treat for the class if you would like. I will get in touch with you to arrange a day and time. If your child has a summer birthday, I will assign them a school birthday. Because of how our schedule is this year, <u>we are asking that all birthday parties take place either right after chapel or during lunch.</u>
- <u>Field Trips:</u> We will be going on our big sixth grade trip in the spring! I am really looking forward to it. Because of that trip, we will only be taking two other field trips this year.

- <u>Cell Phones:</u> If a student has a cell phone, it is to be turned <u>off</u> during the school day. If they are caught using them during the day, I will take it and give it back to the parent. If a student has a smart watch, it is only to be used for telling time. It will be taken away if a student is caught playing games or sending/receiving messages. They are allowed to have their phones on field trips to take pictures <u>only</u>. If this privilege is abused, it will be taken away by the teacher per the cell phone policy in the school handbook.

Please note that the students will also be with Miss Dick, Mrs. Schones, and Mrs. Hobbs throughout the day. They will be expected to abide by the same rules and obey them at all times. All of the above is subject to change at the teacher's discretion; however, if something changes, we will let you know in a note, email or via GroupMe. Thank you for all your support.

-Classroom Economy-

Each student will start with \$100 on the first day of school. They will have the opportunity to earn up to \$100 per week by getting their planner signed each day. They will earn \$20 for each day that their planner is signed. They will pay for any fines they incur throughout the month. They will also have the opportunity to earn bonuses and shop in the class store.

Dates:

- Students will be paid every morning that they come to school with their planners signed the day before.
- Account statements will be sent home the first Tuesday of every month for the previous month. They must be signed and return by a parent the next day.
- Store will be on Tuesday of the following week.

Bonuses:

- Get a compliment from another teacher \$200
- Go above and beyond in showing kindness or responsibility \$400
- Earn an A on a test \$100
- Earn an A on a quiz \$50
- Earn 100% on a test \$100 + coupon

Fines:

Fines will be paid immediately upon violation. Students who cannot pay their fines will work off their balance with community service (i.e. extra lunchroom jobs, etc.) All fines and bonuses for the month will be reflected on the monthly statement.

Store:

Students are able to participate in the class store each month if they have the funds to pay for it. Students can choose not to participate in store if they wish to save their remaining money.
