

Our Class

We have 10 students in Pre-K. 5 boys and 5 girls

Meet Mrs. Sikes

Hello! My name is Mrs. Sikes, and I am so excited to be teaching your amazing children! This year is going to be an adventurous year full of learning God's Word and about all His creations! I am so thrilled to see what God has in store for us. I look forward to learning about all the special things that make each student unique.

I grew up in Germany but have been living in the United States for 30 years. I am married to Jeff Sikes who is the Lead Pastor at the Church of the Nazarene, and we have two adult sons. Nathaniel lives in Weatherford and works at the VA Center. Benjamin lives in Yukon and is married to Sarah, a lovely young woman who is a pediatric genetic counselor. Benjamin is a Youth Pastor at the Fellowship @ Western Oaks Church in Oklahoma City. They are expecting Triplets on October 1st, 2025.

15 years of my life were spent ministering with an international and interdenominational Christian Drama company, which involved working in schools in many different countries. Presently I am the Co-Pastor at the Nazarene Church in town and love teaching children. This is my eleventh-year teaching at WOCS, and each year has been a blessing to me as I watch children discover the joy of learning.

I love teaching young children, because it is exciting to see them learn new things and acquire the skills that we take for granted. I look forward to another amazing school year!

Classroom Discipline Policy

I believe that a healthy classroom and learning environment for your child involves age-appropriate rules and consequences. Below are the classroom rules and some of the consequences you can expect throughout the year. God's grace is new every day, I will never hold the behavior of the previous day against the student the next day. I want to work with your children as much as possible, for the purpose of order in the classroom; however, students who are displaying disruptive behaviors will be given appropriate consequences at the discretion of the teacher. This includes breaking the regular classroom rules or any other behavior that is harmful and repeatedly disruptive to other students.

Our Rules

- Eyes are watching (point to your eyes)
- Ears are Listening (tug on one earlobe)
- Mouth Quiet (put your finger to your lips)
- Hands Helping (hold your hands in front of you)
- Feet crisscross or feet on the floor

We will be using an adjusted "Love and Logic" discipline in the classroom, which relies on giving the child choices rather than demands.

Consequences

When I obey the rules:

Able to participate in all activities that are offered.

Sticker or candy prize

Note home to tell your parents how awesome you are!

When I do not obey the rules:

- 1. Warning
- 2. Talking with the teacher to make a better choice.
- 3. Spending time in "Ruach" (Behavioral Health Center)
- 4.. Missing out on center time or other activities if I continue to make unwise choices.
- 5. Follow through by talking to the parent if student chooses not to participate appropriately in classroom activities continuously.

Severe Clause:

Any student who is putting him/herself (or any other student) in danger will be immediately removed from the classroom until they calm down and can discuss the situation. They will be sent to our principal, Mrs. Cornelius, and parents will be called.

Classroom Procedures

Leader/Helper

- Each student will have the opportunity to serve as the class leader/helper during each week.
- The duties of the leader/helper include:
- -Line Leader / Line caboose
- -Snack Person: Help hand out snacks and help hand out supplies as needed.
- -Community Helper: Help wipe down tables during center time

Bell Work

• As students arrive each morning, they will put away their backpack in their locker, put their water bottle on the water table, turn in their folder, go to their seat, and begin working on the bell work at their desk. Please have your student place his or her lunch bag in the white basket underneath "Cat in The Hat" in the Pre-K entry way.

Story Time

- Students will have the opportunity to talk and answer questions about shared reading experiences after the book is completed.
- During reading, students will sit quietly with their hands in their laps or at their desk and listen to the story without interrupting.

Seat Work

- During seatwork students must work quietly at their desk.
- If a student needs help, she/he must raise their hand and wait for the teacher.
- If students finish their work early, they may choose a whiteboard or a manipulation box or do a different activity that I have prepared in advance for them.

Center Time

• During centers, students may talk freely while playing, but if it gets too noisy and disruptive the student will have a time out at the "Ruach" Center.

Active Learning

• During active learning sessions it is very important for students to follow all teachers' directions.

Lunch is from 11:30 - 12:00pm.

• You are always welcome to join your child for lunch or volunteer to help serving lunches.

Rest Time

• During rest time (12:30-1:25 pm) students are asked to lie on their mats quietly if they do not sleep. I will be playing classical or instrumental praise music or read-aloud stories during this time. Each child is asked to bring a kindermat and a small blanket. The blanket will be stored in their cubby box and will be sent home each Friday. All kindermats will be cleaned each Friday.

Restroom

- The restroom is ONLY for using the bathroom and washing hands.
- Playing in the restroom will not be tolerated.
- We will take classroom restroom breaks after chapel, before morning recess, after each recess and before lunch. Restroom breaks in the afternoon happen according to need.

Weekly Schedule

After chapel each morning, we will be in our classroom other than for recess, lunch, and restroom breaks. The afternoons will include these special classes weekly:

Monday, Wednesday, and Friday – P.E. (1:30 – 2:00 pm) (Please send your student in Tennis Shoes on those days!)

Tuesday and Thursday – Music (2:00 – 2:30 pm) Friday – Art (2:30 – 3:00 pm)

Tuesday Folders

Every Tuesday your student will come home with a blue folder. This folder contains important information that should be looked over carefully. You will need to return the folder the next day, Wednesday.

During the week your student will bring home her or his School Folder with his or her daily work. The folder needs to be returned the following day.

Show and Tell

We will have "show and tell" on Friday mornings. An assigned student will be allowed to bring **one** item to share with the class. I will send a "Show and Tell" bag home with the student. The item should be able to fit in the bag and must have an on/off switch. Parents please do not let your child bring toys, stuffed animals, lipstick etc. to class <u>except on his or her show and tell days.</u> Please make arrangements with me if a child wants to bring their pet or any other special item for Show and Tell. "Show and Tell" starts the first week in October.

Classroom Parties

The Weatherford campus celebrates three holidays. Please keep in mind that we do not celebrate secular holidays or holidays in a secular manner, like Halloween, St. Patrick's Day, Santa Claus, Easter Bunnies and Cupids on Valentine's Day.

Christmas Party, December 19th.

God's Love Party, February 14th.

Resurrection Party, April 2nd.

Volunteer parents will organize these parties and take an active part in making the parties enjoyable for the kids.

Snack Policy

We will have snack time each morning at 9:45 am. Each month I will print out a snack calendar and send it home with your child. When you purchase or make a snack, please keep in mind that we strive to have healthy snacks. Snacks need to be packaged individually for each child. Remember that our students are 4yrs old and adjust the snack size accordingly. Thank you! There are times when our curriculum includes ideas for specific snacks that support the lesson. I will share those on GroupMe or in the weekly newsletter, but you are not obligated to provide those. For special occasions (like a birthday), you are welcome to bring a special treat which we will have in the afternoon, just let me know in advance. Each child is encouraged to bring a water bottle to the classroom daily.

Field Trips

We will have four field trips throughout the year. The dates and locations are to be announced. As the trips approach, we will be sending you information in the Tuesday folders. Oklahoma Law stipulates that all children five and under need to be sitting in a car seat while riding in a car.

Attendance/Homework

I do not assign homework in Pre-K. You may review the letters with your child at home as we learn them. The only activity that I would like the parents to do with their student is practice the memory verse that the students recite individually on Fridays in class. When your child recites the memory verse in class, he or she will receive a "dum-dum".

School starts at 8:20 am and ends at 3:10 pm.

Please be on time to make sure your child is in his/her seat by 8:15 am. BeforeCare starts at 7:30 am and the classroom door opens at 8:10 am at which time, your child will be allowed in the classroom. Chapel starts each morning at 8:20 am and I do not want any child to miss chapel. According to school policy, "students who are absent in excess of 10 days in one semester, 20 days in 2 semesters may be required to repeat that grade." Each day we are learning something new. It is important for your student to attend each day, so they do not fall behind.

Our school policy states, "If your child has a fever, you cannot send your child back to school for 24 hrs." If you know that your child will not be coming to school because of sickness and will miss one or more days of school, please message me through GroupMe. You may pick up your child's work for days missed.

I look forward to helping and encouraging your child to progress spiritually, academically, and socially. I trust that it will be a wonderful school year for all of us! Please do not hesitate to contact me with any joys, questions, or concerns.
