Subjects, Assignments & Assessments

Bible: The assigned Memory Verse is Acts 9:1-19, "The Conversion of Paul." Students are expected to complete the Unit 5 Study Guide for Days 1–5, and the Memory Verse Test will take place next week. Please also complete the designated handouts from Unit 5.

Language: Lessons 38–40 are on the schedule this week, with Quiz 7 taking place on Wednesday.

Math: Lessons 28–29 will cover pages 49–52. Activities for the week include the Liquid Measure Lab and Handling Money. The Math Test is set for Monday. Students should continue practicing speed drills, multiplication tables, and flash cards. Families are encouraged to work together at home on multiplication tables. The curriculum is advancing to multi-digit multiplication and division.

Reading: Lessons 38-40 are assigned, with Student Workbook activities on pages 43-46. Quiz 7 is scheduled for Wednesday.

Spelling: List 9 has been introduced, and Workbook pages 35–37 are related to this content. Because of the shortened week, the spelling test will be given on Tuesday, October 14.

Science: Chapter 4 is focused on Vertebrates. Focus on Lessons 43-44 this week; Quiz 4c is Tuesday.

Key Things to Remember

- Math Test is on Monday make sure to review speed drills and multiplication tables at home.
- Quiz 7 for Language and Reading will take place on Wednesday.
- Spelling Test is moved to Tuesday, October 14, due to the abbreviated week.
- Science Quiz 4c scheduled for Tuesday.
